### 30 YEARS AGO - 1985

#### NANUA RACES—18-20TH OCTOBER

After an early start on Friday morning we gathered Pat & John at Gawler Bypass and continued to Truro where the local Bakery had just opened. Normally, this would have been bypassed, however Pat insisted that we stop for morning tea. ie: pasties and fresh buns. Having filled our bellies we proceeded to the end of town where Peter, Helen and boys were anxiously awaiting our arrival.

The trip was casual, sitting at about 80kph with an occasional burst to allow the semi traffic through our ranks. A rest stop was taken at Waikerie prior to arriving at Renmark where we refueled, ie: ice-creams and petrol. It was here that we left the bitumen and travelled 50km along the old Wentworth Road before heading North parallel to the border, through some very interesting station country and Danggali Conservation Park. During our lunch stop-more pasties and buns-we were entertained by one of the local station-hands. He told us that he would not be attending the races this year as he had to work on the Monday after the event and he could not trust himself to be capable of fronting up. Having attended the meeting, I now know what he meant. All of us agreed that the Danggali Conservation Park would make an interesting place to revisit during a three or four day period. We finally arrived at Kimberly Station at 4.30pm, set up camp and cooked tea on the fire whilst watching the many people arrive throughout the evening.

Saturday—Race Day:-Had a bit of a sleep in and finished breakfast at 10am The events at Nanua started at 11am so we took a stroll to the betting ring and bar area where there was plenty of activity to be seen. We placed our bets on the Caulfield Cup (\$1 each way) none of which proved successful. It was interesting to meet and talk to some of the local identities, who were introduced to us by Peter. The day was very busy, so we decided to have an afternoon nap and prepare ourselves for the evening Barn Dance. A good band, a few cool drinks and plenty of happy country people was the right recipe to make for a goodnight's entertainment, during which the trophies for the day's events were presented. Late in the night a country women's supper was prepared in the rear room of the shed. If you have not had the opportunity to partake in one of these, you do not know what you are missing. Our party went to bed in the early hours but we could still hear the music at 3am.

Sunday:- An early rise to eggs and bacon, then packed ready for the trip home. When we left, there were many people still carrying on from the night before. Some of the cowboys didn't look very well. The monotony of opening and closing some 35 station gates was broken by the occasional stop for a chat and a cool drink with various people who were returning from the races.

We were also introduced to Quondongs. It became a competition to spot a tree that was bearing ripe fruit, stop the vehicle and get out in time to try and fill your bag before Helen beat you to it. For the uninformed, a Quondong is a wild Peach growing on a tree which is a parasite. Our interest was in the Quondong Pie the following week.

After lunch the gates became less and we made good time to Morgan and then on to home.




