
Also, please do not forget the ever-popular photo competition at the November General Meeting. Unfortunately we will miss this due to Johns' daughters' wedding in the UK.

The other event this time round is that old club favourite, Peake. Coverage of the trip including report and some great pictures starts on page 10.








A night to remember


